Notes: Non-resident cases have been excluded. Only incident cases are reported. *E. coli* O157:H7, *Streptococcal-Group B* (invasive disease in infants <30 days old), *Streptococcus pneumoniae*, *Vibrio* spp., VRE and *Yersiniosis* became reportable in 1997. *Streptococcus pneumoniae* is lab reportable only. *Haemophilus influenzae* b includes all invasive *H. influenzae* b, not just meningitis, as of 1995. *Meningococcal* includes all invasive disease caused by *Neisseria meningitidis*, not just meningitis. *Salmonella* Paratyphi A, *Salmonella* paratyphi B, and *Salmonella* paratyphi C have been reported separately from other *Salmonella* spp. beginning in 1997. Animal Rabies cases are not included. Hepatitis D has been reported separately from Hepatitis non-A non-B since 1997. Hepatitis E has been reported separately from Hepatitis non-A non-B beginning in 1998.
